The General Service Office is a repository for AA's shared experience. It fulfills our primary purpose by: (1) providing service, information and experience to groups worldwide; (2) publishing literature; (3) supporting the activities of the General Service Board of AA and (4) carrying forward recommendations of the General Service Conference.

GSO's history dates back to 1938, when the about-to-be-published book, Alcoholics Anonymous, provided a name for the small society known only as the Alcoholic Foundation. The Foundation's rapidly expanding office soon served as the focal point for questions about AA from around the world, and in time became the General Service Office as we know it today.

The former Alcoholic Foundation is now called the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous. Its trustees, alcoholic and nonalcoholic alike, and directors are entrusted with the supervision of the two service agencies —Alcoholics Anonymous World Services, Inc. and AA Grapevine, Inc.— and are the custodians of funds contributed by the groups.....

CAME TO BELIEVE...

This month we begin several new features, in a continued effort to bring you more useful information and resources for maintaining sobriety. On this page we will offer various types of general AA information. You may have noticed that we have added one of the 12 AA Concepts, (Concept 7 for the 7th month) on the front page. Below is an expanded discourse on the value of the 12 Concepts.

The “**Twelve Concepts for World Service**”...are an interpretation of A.A.’s world service structure. They reveal the evolution by which it has arrived in its present form, and they detail the experience and reasoning on which our operation stands today. These Concepts therefore aim to record the “why” of our service structure in such a fashion that the highly valuable experience of the past, and the lessons we have drawn from that experience, can never be forgotten or lost.

Quite rightly, each new generation of A.A. world servants will be eager to make operational improvements. Unforeseen flaws in the present structure will doubtless show up later on. New service needs and problems will arise that may make structural changes necessary. Such alterations should certainly be effected, and these contingencies squarely met.

Yet we should always realize that change does not necessarily spell progress. We are sure that each new group of workers in world service will be tempted to try all sorts of innovations that may often produce little more than a painful repetition of earlier mistakes. Therefore it will be an important objective of these Concepts to forestall such repetitions by holding the experiences of the past clearly before us. And if mistaken departures are nevertheless made, these Concepts may then provide a ready means of safe return to an operating balance that might otherwise take years of floundering to rediscover.

There will also be seen in these Concepts a number of principles which have already become traditional to our services, but which have never been clearly articulated and reduced to writing. For example: the “Right of Decision” gives our service leaders a proper discretion and latitude; the “Right of Participation” gives each world servant a voting status commensurate with his (or her) responsibility, and “Participation” further guarantees that each service board or committee will always possess the several elements and talents that will insure effective functioning. The “Right of Appeal” protects and encourages minority opinion; and the “Right of Petition” makes certain that grievances can be heard, and properly acted upon. These general principles can of course be used to good effect throughout our entire structure.

In other sections, the Concepts carefully delineate those important traditions, customs, relationships and legal arrangements that weld the General Service Board into a working harmony with its primary committees and with its corporate arms of active service — A.A. World Services, Inc. and The A.A. Grapevine, Inc. This is the substance of the structural framework that governs the internal working situation at A.A.’s World Headquarters.

Concern has been expressed lest the detailed portrayal of our internal structure might not later harden down into such a firm tradition or gospel that necessary changes would be impossible to make. Nothing could stray further from the intent of these Concepts. The future advocates of structural change need only make out a strong case for their recommendations — a case convincing to both the Trustees and to the Conference. This is no more than would be required for the transaction and passage of any other important piece of A.A. business. Save for an exception or two, it is noteworthy that the Conference Charter itself can be easily amended.

Old Business

Discussion about the proposed changes to by-laws. Motion made to table discussion until July Central Office meeting due to low COR attendance. Ken L. to provide current by-law language and proposed language to Greg C. for publication in July PIJ.:

Proposed changes:

Change of Election Steering Committee Members to immediately at the Close of Nominations

Currently the voting process requires CORs to wait one month after nominations have ended. This would empower the CORs to immediately vote the conscience of their group in March and not delay the process by voting in April. This was the original procedure up until two years ago.

Change the qualifications of the Steering Committee Nominees (other than Chair) to no longer have previous COR or Steering Committee experience. They would still have to have 2 years of Sobriety to be nominated by a COR.

Opening up nominations by CORs to include any AA member with 2+ years of sobriety would allow for more nominations for positions. Nominations for some positions, like ACTIVITIES, are very difficult to get. This was the original procedure up until 2 years ago.

A Nominee for Any Steering Committee position is not eligible if that person has already served in the same position for a full-term previously – unless there are no other nominees for that position.

Encourages a "Spirit of Rotation."

New Business

A proposed change to the Central Office by-laws was introduced and will be voted on by the CORs at the July meeting. As directed by our CPA, the Acadiana Central Office needs to get a tax-exempt status to file its taxes to the IRS. To receive a tax-exempt ID number, the by-laws must state a disbursement plan of its current finances in the Central Office should shut down/close. The Disbursement Plan must be distributed to another tax-exempt organization which currently holds a tax-exempt ID number (such as the La. State Area Assembly). The proposed change to the by-laws should reflect that: **In the event of the closure of the Acadiana Central Office, any remaining assets/funds will become the property of the La. State Area Assembly.**

A proposal to allocate Prudent Reserve funds to pay for two Central Office representatives to attend the Inter-group/Central Office/AAWS Seminar in Oklahoma City, OK was introduced. The estimated cost of sending two representatives in October 2007 is \$1,221.20 including airfare, hotel, meals, and registration. The CORs voted 5-0 in favor and approved the Steering Committee to spend \$1,221.20.

Motion to close. Second. Meeting closed with Lord's Prayer.

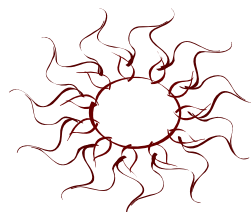

GROUNDHOG DAY

My Groundhog day was April 16, 2001. It was about one in the morning when I was rudely awakened from my peaceful nap. It was the flashlight tapping on my window and when I opened my eyes they were inundated by flashing blue lights. "Why can't these cops just give me a break? What business is it of theirs to wake me up and haul me off to jail again? After all, my foot was firmly planted on the brake pedal! Was I not on a side street parked sensibly at the red light so I would not obstruct anything too important?"

It seemed like yesterday that I had been patting myself on the back for having only four DUP's at 45 years old. Now, at 48, I was on my way to my 7th! It was that ex-wife of mine's fault. If she had only kept hauling me around like she had been for the last 15 years I wouldn't be in such a mess! And how could I, whom had never owed anybody, be fifty grand in credit card debt? How could I have come so far so fast? It never dawned on me that alcohol had anything to do with my problems. I just knew that God was picking on me again. After all, wasn't I the nicest guy in the world except for my "Job" complex. (Job in the Bible, that is.)

Anyway, after getting put on probation for blowing beer breath in the judges face, and getting put in detox instead of jail by a kindly probation officer, I went through two months of severe shakes while attending five or six meetings a day. I then spent 34 days in Ramar on orders from the court, and came out sober. So, if you are new at this sobriety thing, take heart! I haven't been in handcuffs if five and a half years. I still owe a little bit of money, but not to the judge, and I haven't been to prison. YET.
