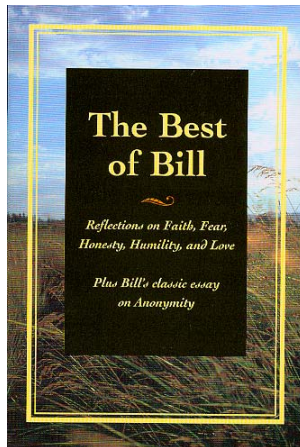

WHAT IS A CENTRAL OFFICE?

A central office (or intergroup) is an A.A. service office that involves partnership among groups in a community—just as A.A. groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. A central office is established to carry out certain functions common to all the groups—functions which are best handled by a centralized office—and it is usually maintained, supervised, and supported by these groups in their general interest. It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

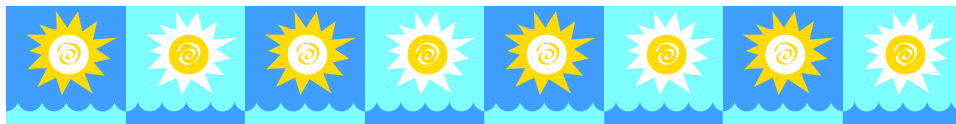


FUNCTIONS OF A CENTRAL OFFICE

The A.A. experience has demonstrated that central offices are helpful, particularly in populous areas. There are nearly 1000 central/intergroup offices throughout the world, performing vital A.A. services. These constitute a network of service outlets and A.A. contacts to help carry the A.A. message. Sometimes, however, central office ventures have bogged down in disputes over money, authority, and like matters—thus becoming less effective in carrying the A.A. message. It's not always clear why these troubles have come up, but often it's been because the proper functions of a central office were not clearly explained or understood, or there was some disregard of the principles in A.A.'s Twelve Traditions. So the following suggestions have been made to outline the basic services a central office might offer:

- **A.A. Inquiries**—By providing an Alcoholics Anonymous listing in the local telephone directory, the central office may receive inquiries from those seeking help. They will refer the caller to a nearby A.A. group, where sponsorship may be arranged, or have a twelfth stepper contact them.
- **Office Facilities**—The central office can maintain a conveniently located office in which paid workers and/or volunteers are available to carry the message of A.A. to the alcoholic.
- **Meeting Lists**—At regular intervals, the central office may publish and distribute up-to-date lists of meetings and other information about local A.A. services.
- **Information Exchange**—The service office may function as a clearinghouse for the circulation and exchange of information among all the A.A. groups in the community. In this same connection, a logical function of the central office is to provide “program exchange” meetings, where group program chairpersons meet regularly to exchange meetings with other groups.
- **Local A.A. Events**—An A.A. central office is a logical body to manage the details of an annual dinner, picnic, or convention, if the participating groups wish it.
- **A.A. Bulletin or Newsletter**—The preparation of a publication for periodic distribution to A.A. groups is often a function of the central office.

Group Spotlight

The **Primary Purpose** group of Lafayette began meeting August 3, 2004 at its current location. It was started by Marcelle T. and Shelley B., who were members of the Any Lengths group at Lafayette Street and Avenue B. Any Lengths was looking for a new location and that search led to the formation of Primary Purpose with two meetings weekly at the East Bayou Baptist Church at 2234 Kaliste Saloom Road. Much of the group's philosophy is borrowed from an existing group in Dallas, Texas. Both groups take their name from AA's Fifth Tradition: "Each group has but one *primary purpose* – to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers."

Primary Purpose now meets four times each week, at 12:00 Noon, Monday through Thursday. Thursday's meeting is an *Open* meeting and all the others are *Closed*. The Monday meeting is a Step meeting during which a portion of Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions is read aloud by those present, who also share on the topics presented in the book. On Tuesday, readings come from the personal stories in the Big Book Alcoholics Anonymous interspersed with the sharing of our individual experience, strength and hope. Wednesday is a *Closed Discussion* meeting in which the chairperson selects a topic from AA-approved literature for group discussion. The Thursday *Open* meeting is another Big Book meeting, this time limited to the *main text* of the book found in the first 164 pages.

All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome and invited to attend Primary Purpose meetings. Of course, anyone may attend the *Open* meeting. We are a home group and, as such, welcome new members. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking!

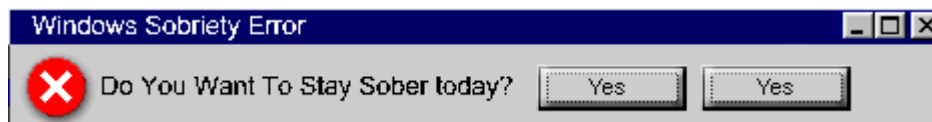

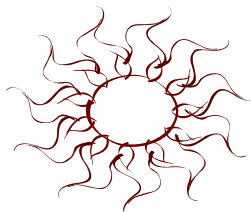
